This year our fall history event on November 3, 2019 will celebrate a number of Cotati women who contributed to our community over the last century. Local panelists will share stories of three particular citizens who lived in the city from the 1930s to the 2010s: Ethel Clothier, Marguerite Hahn, and Prue Draper.

Marie McNaughton will also share her ongoing research into the spirited women who founded Cotati's first Ladies' Improvement Club and the city's first female voters.

As part of the national 2020 Women's Vote Centennial Initiative, the Cotati Historical Society, Bodega Bay Historical Society, Geyserville Historical Society, Healdsburg Museum, Petaluma Historical Library and Museum, Russian River Historical Society, Santa Rosa Historical Society, and the Windsor Historical Society will help the West County Museum fill its display room with exhibits honoring "Extraordinary Women" of Sonoma County, from December 5, 2019 to March 15, 2020.

Each historical society or museum has selected a few extraordinary women who have made significant contributions to

Ethel Clothier, a 1930s Cotati businesswoman; Marguerite Hahn, Cotati librarian, fire department dispatcher. Second World War nurse, and local news correspondent; and Prue Draper, who edited The Cotatian newspaper for

many years and helped found the society and museum. The West County Museum is located at 261 Main St Sebastopol.

Susan Kashack Helps Spread Cotati History With Sign, Tours & Brochures

Susan Kashack, who volunteers for the Cotati Police Department, Chamber of Commerce, and Historical Society, is generating fresh collaborative energy among Cotati agencies, business, and history telling.

Having retired from Sonoma State University after 32 years, the last ten in marketing and communications, Susan offers a wealth of story-telling expertise. Editor of the university magazine, she also oversaw the news function and campus communication.

Working on one project seems to inspire other projects. For example, working on a new walking tour route and brochure of Cotati, she learned that the floor of the Redwood Cafe is made of lumber from the 1920s Cotati Speedway. She immediately said, "There needs to be a sign telling people that story."

So she designed the one pictured below to hang on the cafe wall to tell the story of the once-upon-a-time international raceway and the many local projects made from its disassembly.

One of the local spots soon to be featured in the walking tour is the Cotati Inn, built in 1932. Once a classy establishment specializing in duck dinners, sold and con-



verted in the 1950s to Sophie's Cotati Inn. it later became Michel's restaurant. In 1968 it became a popular hippie -era cabaret called Inn of the Beginning. Visiting musicians included Arlo Guthrie, Janis Joplin, Grateful Dead, Jerry Garcia, Joan Cotati Baez and many more

who drew overflow crowds. Today the building houses Friar Tucks Pub and Spancky's Bar.

These buildings and many more are chronicled in the new Cotati Walking Tour booklet, available this fall.

Come Visit "Wa"! The CHS Japanese-American Exhibit Continues Through October 12th

CHS is especially proud of our current exhibit of historical and cultural information and artifacts relating to Japanese families in our area. One of our museum cases is dedicated to a rare collection of arts and crafts made by local Japanese while incarcerated during the Second World War. Other cases feature personal and household items as well as valuable antiques on loan from local families.

Also inside the museum multiple panel displays include historical images, letters, and family photos about Sonoma County's Japanese-American community from the 1880s to the present.

The museum is open every Saturday, from 1 to 4 pm and the second Tuesday of each month, from 5 to 7 pm. Special tours and appointments are available weekdays and weekends through October. Contact us at 794-0305 or chsinfo@sonic.net to make arrangements.
